At a regularly scheduled and properly noticed public meeting on July 15, 2019, with a quorum being present, a quorum being 4 Commissioners, Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 6D voted 7-0-0 in support of the U.S. Soccer Foundation's request to create an acrylic mini-soccer pitch as part of the sports facilities at the Randall Recreation Center located at South Capitol St and I St SW.

The ANC is committed to supporting projects that enhance the ability of residents to enjoy their neighborhood, especially those that provide opportunities for children throughout the District to play outdoors, learn new skills, and develop their sense of teamwork and camaraderie.

Accordingly, the ANC will support U.S. Soccer Foundation's installation of a mini-soccer pitch directly to the west of the existing basketball court in the open court space at the Randall Recreation Center. RE: Digital Signage Application for 1250 Half St. SE

Dear Mr. Bailey,

At a regularly scheduled and properly noticed public meeting on July 15, 2019 with a quorum being present, a quorum being four Commissioners, Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 6D voted 6-0-0 not to oppose the application for digital signage as submitted by Jair Lynch pursuant to Zoning Commission Z.C. Case No. 06-46E.

For your reference, the ANC 6D strongly opposed the Nationals Park and Ballpark District Designated Entertainment Area Signage Regulations Amendment Act of 2016 ("the regulation"). The ANC believes that digital signage on and around Nationals Park generally is not aesthetically appealing and does not enhance the Ballpark Entertainment Zone or the neighborhood. Further, the ANC believes that the digital signage allowed in the 2016 regulations risks degrading the atmosphere of the neighborhood and creating an unappealing environment, especially through the use of animation and video on the signage which may present dangerous distractions to drivers and pedestrians alike.

In the case of the application for digital signage at 1250 Half St. SE, however, the ANC recognizes that the Applicant has tailored its signs to complement those proposed by JBG on its property at 1201 Half St SE and that these signs are similar in that they are immediately adjacent to the entrance to Nationals Park.

The ANC reads the Applicant's proposed submissions to the Zoning Commission as a clear articulation of its intent to append digital advertising signage to the building's facades, noting that the Applicant specifically includes examples of digital advertising signage in its submissions to the Zoning Commission.

Given this, the ANC does not oppose the Applicant's submission to DCRA for the signs. The ANC notes, however, that should the Zoning Commission deny, fail to support, or otherwise reject any of the Applicant's proposed signs, ANC6D will, as a consequence, withdraw its support for that sign(s).

In addition, the ANC appreciates the Applicant's willingness to make a donation to local organizations as a community benefit resulting from this signage. The ANC believes that this donation helps to offset the risk the neighborhood is absorbing by allowing the signage and represents an important investment in the success of the neighborhood. The ANC will select the beneficiaries of these donated funds at its September 2019 meeting. Jair Lynch will donate a total of \$100,000 for such improvement projects, as follows: (a) 1250 Half St digital signs: \$75,000 and (b) 1250 Half St static sign: \$25,000.

In conclusion, the ANC does not oppose this application to DCRA for digital signage because 1) it is within the parameters allowed by the regulation, 2) it mirrors the digital signage proposed by JBG; 3) it has been adjusted to moderate the impact on the affected future commercial tenants, and 4) it is accompanied by a welcome community benefit in support of the neighborhood.

RE: Request for Assistance, Action and Monitoring of The Kiley/UIP/Davis Construction Project

Dear Mayor Bowser:

At a regularly scheduled and properly noticed public meeting on Monday, July 15, 2019 with a quorum being present, a quorum being 4 commissioners, Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 6D voted 6-0-0 to approve the following letter regarding The Kiley/UIP/Davis Construction Project located in the rear of 301 G Street, SW.

The Kiley/UIP Construction Project was initiated to construct a new multiunit residential apartment Building in the rear of 301 G Street, S.W.

There are serious concerns regarding the operation of this construction site. There have been constant and continuous violations of District laws and regulations which pose a constant threat to public safety, health, and welfare, including:

- 1. Dump Trucks sitting and idling along through G Street, S.W. (between 3rd Street, S.W. and 6th Street, S.W.) for long periods of time;
- 2. Dump trucks blocking, impeding and hindering motor traffic on 4th Street, S.W. between I Street, S.W. and D Street, S.W.;
- 3. Dump trucks exiting the work site on 3rd and G Street, S.W. and traveling across 4th Street, S.W. along G Street, S.W. to 7th Street, S.W., a residential neighborhood, in violation of the Construction Plan which is supposed to use only 4th Street, S.W. and I Street, S.W.;
- 4. Dump trucks, panel truck, or pick-up trucks blocking driveways along G Street, S.W. between 3rd Street, S.W. and 4th Street, S.W. impeding ingress and egress from Townhomes, Apartment Buildings along G Street, S.W.;

- 5. Dump trucks constantly exiting from G Street, S.W. or 4th Street, S.W. hauling debris that are uncovered and thereby causing debris to fall from the dump trucks onto parked vehicles and the District roadways creating a health and safety hazard to the community;
- 6. Dump trucks, panel trucks, and pick-up trucks parked or idling in the traffic circle at 3rd and G Streets, S.W. impeding and hindering through neighborhood vehicle traffic posing a serious safety hazard and I violation of District law;
- 7. Dump trucks, panel truck, and pick-up trucks parked in or idling in the pedestrian crosswalk at 3rd and G Street, S.W. at the traffic circle;
- 8. Dump trucks, panel trucks and pick-up truck traveling along G Street, S.W. at high rates of speed limits posing a safety hazard in a residential neighborhood and in a School Zone Area (Amidon-Bowen Elementary School);
- 9. Irregular morning starting times for initiation of construction activity (examples include: 6:45am, 6:52am (Saturday)).

On June 11, 2019, three (3) ANC 6D Commissioners met with representatives of The Kiley/UIP/Davis Group to discuss the concerns noted above following numerous concerns and complaints from numerous neighborhood residents. The representatives made certain assurances that the concerns would be addressed. There were assurances that there would be regular and periodic construction updates, there would be no standing or idling of trucks in the 3rd Street traffic circle, they would instruct contractors and subcontractors on the permitted and approved routes to take to the construction site, there would no longer be dump truck traffic along G Street, S.W. to 7Th Street, S.W., there would be flaggers stationed at the 4th Street, S.W. and G Street, S.W. construction entrances/exits to direct construction truck traffic. To date, only the Flaggers are in place, and the other assurances remain unmet or intentionally violated/disregarded.

While ANC 6D has been supportive of The Kiley/UIP/Davis Group Project, it is extremely concerned that the Project representatives apparent indifference to adhering to their Construction and Transportation Plan, including clear and convincing instructions to contractors and subcontractors, blatant disregard of traffic rules, permitting the hauling of debris from the work site by uncovered dump tracks in violation of District law thereby allowing dirt and debris onto District roadways, among others violations and concerns, poses an undue threat to protecting the health, safety and welfare of residents in this neighborhood and ANC6D.

Thus, ANC 6D is requesting that <u>urgent and immediate</u> steps be undertaken to protect the health, public safety, and welfare of this neighborhood by having the Department of Transportation, Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs and the Metropolitan Police Department (First District) take whatever action necessary and required to inspect, monitor, and ensure compliance by The Kiley/UIP/Davis Group with applicable District laws and regulations.

At a regularly scheduled and properly noticed public meeting on Monday, July 15, 2019 with a quorum being present, a quorum being 4 commissioners, Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 6D voted 7-0-0 to approve the following letter requesting the installation of Temporary Lighting in the one block area of 900 Wesley Place, S.W.

As you may recall, on June 1, 2019, the Southwest Branch Library at 900 Wesley Place S.W. closed so that construction could proceed to construct a new Southwest Branch Library, a project which Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6D has lobbied for and supported wholeheartedly.

However, the closure of the branch location the Southwest has also created a blind spot for pedestrians at that location. Many residents in the Southwest community use this path walking to or from the METRO Station, the CVS Pharmacy, the Safeway, or other business located along 4th Street, S.W. between M Street, S.W. and I Street, S.W., often crossing the current vacant grass lot, commonly referred to as the "CVS Lot". In recent weeks, there have been several incidents of criminal activity in that vicinity, at least two serious shooting incidents involving First District, Metropolitan Police Department, at 3rd and I Streets, S.W. and 3rd and K Street. S.W.

Although we are in the midst of natural Summer lighting, soon we will be facing the Fall and Winter period when that natural lighting will be greatly reduced starting at 4:30pm in the evening.

Thus, In the interest of public safety, and the protection pedestrians, ANC 6D is requesting that Department of Public Works (DPW) or the Department of Transportations (dDOT) install temporary lighting posts in or around this one block area of Wesley Place, S.W. With the temporary closure of the Library, there will be a blind area which is a safety hazard, especially with Summer now upon us.
